'Welcoming the Stranger as Jesus' - I didn't hear Sarah Einerson when she spoke at Calvary earlier this year about Churches United. But a friend passed on her message – and one of the biggest needs was for volunteers. I heard the call...so when Pastor Andrew asked if I might be interested, it wasn't hard to say, 'yes, I think I can do that'. Now, several months later, I am one of the volunteers in

their office at Mt Zion Lutheran Church – in the old Lincoln School building. It has been a humbling yet rewarding experience. At first, it sounded simple – meet the emergency needs of the homeless and low income people in a prayerful way... don't be judgmental nor talk about poor choices...listen...remember that every person needs to be treated with dignity... and most importantly, client information is confidential. Whew. But God is leading all of us volunteers to respond in this manner. Sometimes it can be a challenge...to be patient and understanding...to show love and compassion...to be sensitive to the dynamics of other races...and to be sympathetic to those who are disadvantaged and vulnerable. However, God is also connecting us with each and every person who walks through the door. Funds are limited, but we are usually able to help with gas, food emergencies, or other miscellaneous expenses in a small way – after assessing each situation. I am thankful that Calvary supports Churches United – with monetary donations, numerous items for the care/hygiene bags...and also with volunteers, like myself, who can give of their time and talents.

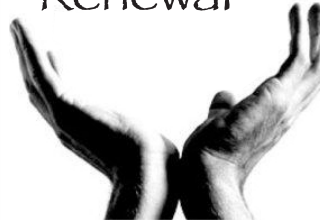
This will help with better record keeping. Women of the ELCA (WELCA) is our November ministry partner.

CALVARY'S FELLOWSHIP OF WOUNDED HEALERS

Calvary offers us abundant opportunities to worship God. In these worship forums we gather to: praise; thank; petition; and seek healing, forgiveness and sacramental blessings from a loving God. On Tuesday

evening in our Renewal Night setting, we worship Him, but we are also given the opportunity to serve Him as His "wounded healers". When God heals and restores us -- He imbues in us new -- and very special sensitivities and insights -- that enable us to respond to His command that we share in helping heal a wounded world.

Many from Calvary have not explored this ministry because they feel it's not for them. As I've discussed this ministry with several of our members, I repeatedly hear that "it seems like this is primarily aimed at addicts." Actually, that may not be far off the mark, as scripture tells us that we are all addicts to sin! Bill Beyer said it another way when he remarked that "we are all recovering from something."

What is a wounded healer? Henri Nouwen has written extensively on the subject of God's Wounded Healers. He explains -- "Nobody escapes being wounded. We are all wounded people, whether physically, emotionally, mentally, or spiritually. The main question is not how can we hide our wounds ..., but how can we put our woundedness in the service of others. When our wounds cease to be a source of shame, and become a source of healing, we have become wounded healers."

Jesus is God's perfect model of the wounded healer. Through Christ's healing of our wounds -- He has empowered each of us with unique capacities to be His wounded healers here in Bemidji.

Nouwen stresses "that speaking about our own wounds is seldom helpful to someone who is in pain." This need not be a confession session. He states, "Mostly it is better not to direct a suffering person's attention to ourselves. We have to trust that our own bandaged wounds will allow us to listen to others with our whole being. That is healing."

You have unique gifts to bring to this mission. Join our community of wounded and caring healers on Tuesday evenings at 6:30 PM, and I promise you that you will gain far more than you give.

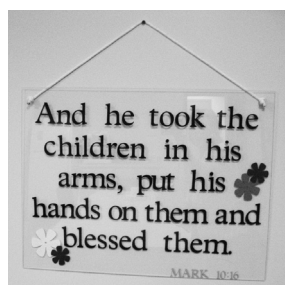
GET READY FOR ENTER THE BIBLE IN 2012!

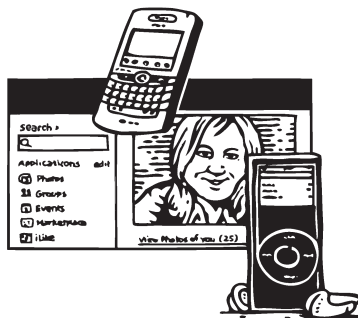
PLACE HOMEMADE OR PURCHASED ITEMS ON THE HAT SCARF AND MITTEN TREE!
