"Dearest Gloria, beautiful child of God"

This is how I greet my child. I have not met Gloria, other than through pictures and words, but God has connected us. I love her and pray for her. Sadly, Gloria lives in Kiambiu Slums, Kenya, in a dirt floored house with mud walls and a corrugated iron roof. This community of 60,000, dreams of having potable water and sanitary waste. Most do not have work and some that do, make about \$26/month as laborers. Gloria, her family and friends are threatened with HIV/AIDS, typhoid fever, malaria - - all which are rampant in the Slums.

My 19 yr. old daughter Cassandra has a child named Edwin that lives in a nearby community. He, too is in danger. Recently, we both got letters telling us of the terrible drought in Africa that has threatened their livestock, which of course, also poses another threat to the food supply for our children, their families and there communities.

On Rally Sunday, both Cassandra and I were "swept up in God's Mission" and without talking to one another, we both knew exactly what we wanted to do if we won the "Kingdom Challenge." When my name was drawn, I knew I had to share it with Cassandra, so she, too, could share in the excitement. We both wanted the money to go to Compassion International, the Christian organization through which we sponsored our children. They are able to use our monthly donations to best help Edwin and Gloria. Gifts above and beyond our regular giving will help others in those two communities as well. I thank you, Calvary, for helping these children of God, and I challenge you, as well; allow your heart to swell as you sponsor a child in need. PARKING LOT UPDATE



A big thank you to Reierson Construction for blessing us with many loads of free, clean dirt to expand our parking lot here at Calvary. We will be seeding down the dirt before winter to prevent erosion and hoping to pave it next year sometime. Reierson also gave us a bid for adding a second driveway from the south. The drive would attach at the T intersection of Peaceful Meadows Road. Currently that is the paved road that leads to the RV park and Bluewater Bait. We would simply put in a gravel road that would allow you to turn LEFT off Peaceful Meadows and enter into

the back parking lot. Again, because Reierson is working now, they have given us an unbeatable price of \$5,600 for more dirt to build up the road, tree removal, 6 inches of class 5 gravel, a culvert and finishing touches. Our leadership believes now is the time to put in this driveway so that we can learn how to use it safely and effectively before we pave and stripe the new parking lot. This is an unbudgeted item in 2011, so we are accepting donations to help make this a reality this fall. If you have any questions, please see Casey or Pastor Genelle.

FROM THE CONGREGATIONAL PRESIDENT

Dear Calvary Members,

Fall is a good time for all of us to look at how we are doing sharing the gifts God has given us and supporting the mission of Calvary. We have fallen considerably below budget and behind our giving of 2010. Staff has done a good job of controlling costs but this short fall means that Calvary will be unable to retire the member loans which are due this year.

We currently have \$188,000 in short term loans from members due in 2011 and 2012. Based upon current giving we estimate that we will have approximately \$25,000 by the end of the year to use to pay off member loans (from dedicated giving to debt reduction and Thrivent Choice funds which council voted to use for debt reduction). We are challenging the congregation to match these funds and help us retire \$50,000 of our member loans by the end of 2011. The balance of the current short term loans will be retired by soliciting 10 year loans from members which will be paid down annually. More details on this effort will follow this winter.

We have all been blessed to be a part of a vibrant growing congregation. We have a great staff, wonderful facility and great members. Please prayerfully consider what you can do to help us reach this goal!

SPIRITUAL PLEDGING

On Sunday, October 30, we will begin our spiritual pledging process for intentional giving for 2012. A breakdown of the proposed general income received through the offering will be shared to show us how to meet our needs in 2012. The Spiritual Pledging process is a conversation between you (and your family) and God. What has God blessed you with, and what is God encouraging you to do with the resources God gives? Some will be able to give way more than the nuts and bolts figure, and some will not be able to reach it. Thanks be to God that we are a family, and we can encourage and support each other in this calling to be generous givers doing what we can here in this place.

No one sees these pledge forms, because we do not base our budget upon the numbers you write down. Our budget is based on our mission goals as a congregation. Pledging is about your response to God at work in your own life. There are

some practical elements to this process but the heart of the matter is you making a intentional, prayerful plan to give some of your money to further God's kingdom here at Calvary and beyond. Without a plan, we find that giving is not a response it is a reaction. So, this year, we encourage you to have a conversation with God and with your family to decide what your intentional plan is going to be to Calvary. Write it down, and we will mail back your pledge half way through 2012 as a reminder to you about your own plan. May God be glorified in our work.



Finance Report

AUGUST

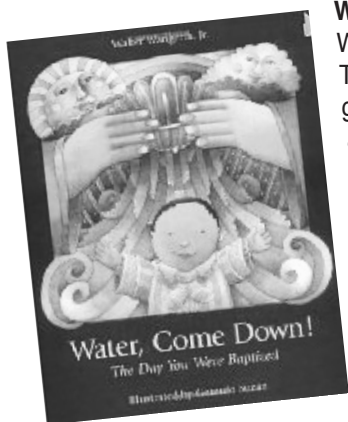
