If you would like to help out please sign up on the poster board in the gathering area or call Kim in the church office.



Twenty men and seventeen women from the region, 7 of whom were from Calvary, took part as "weekenders" in this rich time of Christian fellowship, learning, worship, and rest. They were joined by many more people on the coordinating team. We praise God for the participants and the gift of physical space that we have to share.

"From March 2 through 5, 20 Christian men from Minnesota and North Dakota experienced Via de Cristo - The Way of Christ here at Calvary Lutheran. Do You Ever Have Questions Like These?

Every week we receive some wonderful questions from our confirmation families in their worship notes. They're probably questions that you share. Here, your Calvary pastors share a response to these questions. This month the response is from Pastor Andrew.

WHY ARE THERE SO MANY VERSIONS OF THE BIBLE? IS ONE BETTER THAN THE OTHER?

Good questions! There are lots of different versions of the Bible because God's word can be translated for all kinds of different contexts. This is good because it's one of the ways that God speaks to us "in our own native language" (Acts 2:8), but it can also be overwhelming and confusing.

The original Bible was written over many years and by many authors. Hebrew was used for the Old Testament (plus a few parts are in Aramaic) and Greek for the New Testament. From early on, the Bible was translated into different languages to reach people with the good news of Jesus.

A Bible translation is typically a complete version of the Bible made by one or several people who study the original languages and transfer the words and meanings into another language. Popular English translations include the King James Version, the New International Version, and the New Revised Standard Version (which we typically use during worship at Calvary). These versions differ for a variety of reasons: some translations are "word for word" while some are "meaning for meaning"; some versions are paraphrases that try to phrase the Bible in modern and accessible ways; newer versions of the Bible take into account discoveries of old manuscripts and developments in our understanding of Hebrew and Greek; and every translator has different theological biases that influence the way he/she translates.

Each study Bible has a basic translation, but it adds explanatory notes within the book. These notes might explain a metaphor, give some historical background, or indicate a way to apply the text. A study Bible might have special notes from a denominational perspective, for men or women (Master Builders Bible for Men), or for general students of the Bible (Oxford Annotated Bible).

IS ONE VERSION BETTER THAN THE OTHER?

Many people have their preferences but there's no single "best version." I use the NRSV and NIV, and I hear good things about the ESV; the Oxford, New Interpreters, and Harper Collins study Bibles (all NRSV) were much-used when I was at seminary. At the end of the day, the best version is the one that you're reading. Like a professor of mine said, "I don't care what version you have. Just READ the Bible!"


A Special Gift




