*Oh, to grace how great a debtor I know daily you're constrained to be;
Let my grace now like a fetter bind your wandering heart to me.
Prone to wander, I know you feel it; prone to leave the God you love.
Here's your heart, I'll take and seal it; seal it for my courts above.*

It is such a powerful and personal gift! Your grace. You keep us all together in your arms of grace, and sweet Jesus we need that. Because, wow, how prone we are to wander at times God. How prone we are to leave you. I mean, so much happens in life. So much is out of our control. So much to fear. So much that makes us want to run and hide. So much that makes us pretend like we don't need you.

But you, God, never give up on us. You never stop pursuing us. Even into the depths of death itself you will never let us go!

It is no wonder why Samuel tells us to raise our Ebenezer, that rock that claims our help as coming from you. It is no wonder why the Psalmist in psalm 121 invites us to turn our eyes to the hills and know that our help is in you, our Lord. It is no wonder why Robert Robinson calls us to sing out loud 'hither by thy help we've come'. You keep us steadfast in your love. You pursue us no matter where we go. You connect us, bond us, and unite us in your ever flowing streams of love and mercy! It is a gift we can never repay; a gift that blesses us every day.

Father God, we know there are not always answers to the big questions, and you know that sometimes we get angry, lost, and lonely. But you promise to walk with us through all the highs and lows of life, so that we will never be alone. This promise we received in baptism, that nothing will ever separate us from your love. That you will truly keep our going outs and coming ins today and all days, and for that, we thank you God. We thank you for never giving up on us even when we wander from, ignore, or unjustly judge you and others. We thank you for relentlessly pursuing us no matter where we go. We thank you for taking our hearts, saving them, and washing them clean with your son's precious blood. We thank you for sealing us for your courts above.

Help us to pray without ceasing. Help us call on you for help and trust that you will answer us by faith. Help us know that even when life makes little sense, when tragedies strike that have no good reason, we can lean on your strength and hope in a better tomorrow. For you weave your love without ceasing, and will relentlessly pursue justice in us and through us. May we walk together in you and shine together your ever embracing light of love. In Jesus' name we pray... AMEN.

What is Ash Wednesday?

The imposition of ashes began to develop in the eleventh century where it had become customary to receive ashes at the beginning of Lent. The Christian use of ashes relates to a fourth century Jewish practice where public penitents were dressed in sackcloth and sprinkled with ashes on the head as a sign of repentance. As it is practiced now by many churches and denominations, being marked with ashes is a public acknowledgement that one is a sinner, as we all are. Receiving the ashes in the sign of the cross is a symbol of repentance and forgiveness. The ashes themselves are the burnt palms used on Palm Sunday of the previous year. While receiving the ashes, it is customary to hear these words, "Remember you are dust and to the dust you shall return". They are a reminder of our mortality, that from the dust of the earth we were formed and when we die, we will return to being dust again. Though we are in bondage to this reality, we belong to God. In the repentance of sin and the forgiveness that comes through Jesus' death and resurrection, though we die, we shall live forever. What is Lent?

The word Lent derives from the Middle English word Lenten, meaning springtime – the time of lengthening days. In its earliest form, it consisted of three weeks and was an intense period of spiritual and liturgical preparation for catechumens before they were baptized at Easter. By the time Christianity was legalized in the fourth century, Lent had developed into its current length of forty days. This length connects scripturally to the time Jesus fasted and was tempted in the desert. (Luke 4:1-13). Some now also believe that it relates to the early church's forty-day fasting practices especially engaged by monks. This fast, beginning right after Epiphany stressed prayer and penance. Once most people were Christian and baptized as infants, Lent lost the connection to the preparation of catechumens for baptism and the themes of repentance and fasting became dominant. An Invitation to our Lenten Journey 2026

For quite some time now my heart has been spinning on the call of Jesus to love thy neighbor. That to love God is to love each other. You can't say you love God but hate your neighbor. The two are deeply interwoven in a kind of dance meant to be a living expression of following Christ. Admittedly, as I look out across our state, our country, and our world, this feels like a bit of a tall order. Questions of how do we respond as those who confess Christ as the center of our lives? How do we shine our faith when so much of what we experience seems to be heading in a direction that cares less and less about those whom Jesus paid the closest attention to? Who is the neighbor that God calls us to love? I mean these questions are serious and significant, and they draw us to a way of life that doesn't put ourselves first. Loving thy neighbor is fundamental to life with God. When Jesus says love God and love people, he doesn't say 'some people' or 'those who look like us' but simply, people. Jesus sought all people, especially the lost, the lonely, the broken hearted, the sick, those who society, has deemed the 'least of these' in order to build a community where all are equally loved and cared for. This message is radical, especially right now, but it is the call we walk together with God: The call of all Christians.

This year, as we journey through the Lenten season, you will be invited to reflect on the stuff that clutters our hearts and lives; the stuff that turns us from our walk with God and our love for our neighbors. Worship will see a few changes for the season. Our liturgy on Sunday mornings will find a more traditional flow and the colors of the season will change to purple. We will also be removing the language of "Halleluiahs" from our vocabulary not to be returned until Easter. Our kiddos will help with this on Ash Wednesday and in worship on Sunday. In addition, our Wednesday ministry will change to include a noon Ash Wednesday and Lenten service. We will gather for music, scripture, and a reader's theater presentation of our evening drama. Calvary Alive will still begin with a meal at 5:30pm which flows into Lenten Worship at 6:15pm. In Worship we will sing the beautiful Holden Evening Prayer and experience a five-part drama series, *Lent in the Attic*, that explores themes around how the 'stuff' of our lives affects our faith and walk with God. We are excited to begin this journey again and it all starts on February 18th, with Ash Wednesday worship. Join us for dinner at 5:30pm and worship at 6:15pm. We are also excited to share a new daily devotional resource will be available to walk with you throughout lent. These devotions are written by Calvary members to bless you on your journey. May Lent be a time of renewal in your personal life and may it be a time of renewal and connection for our life together. And all throughout the journey, may you know that you are held in my thoughts and prayers as we walk together in Christ's love. God's peace friends!

Stewardship of Land Survey

Name:

Greetings, friends. We want to thank you for participating in this process of exploring the stewardship of our land resources. The conversations have been rich and faithful, and we appreciate the gift it is to walk together as church. It was clear from the feedback with the Stewardship of Land Forums back in the fall that we should explore multiple options including exploring the feasibility of building on our property, the practicality of leasing the land, as well as what selling part of the property could look like. This feedback led us to have a follow-up conversation in December with our neighbors to the east who are exploring a potential expansion of their company. From that conversation it became clear that they are seeking to purchase 17.5 acres on the east side of our almost 40 acre property with an offer of just over \$1,000,000. With this clarity, we wanted to ask a couple of additional questions for feedback from you:

- 1) Knowing this information, is selling a portion of our property a direction that we should continue to explore as a viable option?**

- 2) If you encourage us to continue exploring this option, what priorities should we hold while doing so? Examples: Should we focus on debt reduction, invest the funds, start new ministries, enhance current ministries, or are there other priorities you see?**

- 3) If you prefer that we do not continue exploring this option, where do you believe we should focus our efforts and why?**
